Smoke Testing Sewer Lines

NOTICE – Manchester Township Public Works Department periodically conducts smoke tests of the sanitary sewer lines. Testing is conducted Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Smoke should not enter premises unless a leak is present. This smoke is non-toxic, non-corrosive, and will not leave a stain. If smoke enters a home, it will soon dissipate. Opening doors and windows will help. Any presence of smoke within the house should be reported to the township office at 764-4646. Avoid unnecessary exposure to the smoke. The smoke is relatively harmless, but all smoke is temporary and quickly disappears after exposure has ceased.

Nuisance Ordinance

Per Ordinance #2007-01, don't place basketball hoops or other sporting equipment in roadway or in road right-of-way so play can occur in the street.

The following are strictly prohibited and declared a nuisance:

- a) The placing of mulch, stone, dirt or building materials from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.
- b) Basketball hoops or other sports equipment within the street or road right-of-way.
- c) Detached trailers or storage units within the cartway.
- d) Dumping of any substances (oil, grass, etc.) into any storm sewer.

Stone or brick mailboxes require a road occupancy permit before construction.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with these provisions may be fined up to \$600.00 per day.



Sewer Backup Claims

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statue, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowners or commercial insurance agent to make sure your carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowners or commercial property policy. Some homeowners policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valulable coverage.

Tips from your Tax Collector

It's tax time again and I'd like to remind you to please write a contact phone number on your check. Unlisted phone numbers make it difficult to reach you if there is a question or problem with your check, resulting in missed rebates and late payments.

The rebate period for 2009 County/Township payments ends at midnight on April 15, 2009, as determined by state law. Please do not ask me to break the law by accepting payments after the deadline. Payments in the night slot on the morning of April 16th will be considered paid at rebate.

Just a reminder for those applying for the State Property Tax and Rent rebate program - the State requires stamped receipts. Bring or send both halves of your tax bill (along with a stamped, self-addressed envelope if paying by mail) and we will promptly return a receipt. Application forms and guidelines for the rebate program are

available online at the PA State website or from your local Representative's office. The Area Agency on Aging can also provide assistance.

As always, a secure night slot on the outside of the Township building is available for payments when the window is closed.







To facilitate the communications that are essential to a quick and effective response to such events, HIPAA permits covered entities to disclose needed information to public officials in a variety of ways. Covered entities may disclose protected health information, without the individual's authorization, to a public health authority acting as authorized by law in response to a man-made or natural emergency see 45 CFR 164.512(b), (see 45 CFR 164.512(f)); 45 CFR 164.512(k)(2)); or judicial and administrative proceedings (see 45 CFR 164.512(e)).

Medic 102-2 Now Located In Manchester Township

The Alert Fire Co. has partnered with Memorial Hospital to locate an advanced life support unit in the fire station located at 3118 N. George Street in Emigsville. This unit provides the advanced care needed for people experiencing medical conditions such as chest pain, heart attacks, difficulty breathing, seizures, strokes, diabetic problems and serious injuries and accidents. This will reduce the response time for residents of Manchester Township by nearly 10 minutes. In the past this unit responded from Memorial Hospital.

Medic 102-2 provides services 24 hours per day, 7 days per week from this location. Its primary coverage areas are Manchester Township, East Manchester Township, parts of Newberry and Conewago Townships, Manchester, Goldsboro, York Haven and Mt Wolf Boroughs. This unit also provides back up coverage for the rest of York County.

The following items should not be placed out for Yard Waste Collection:

- Leaf Waste (Note: Manchester Township provides this service)
- Dirt or Stones
- Fruits and/or Vegetables
