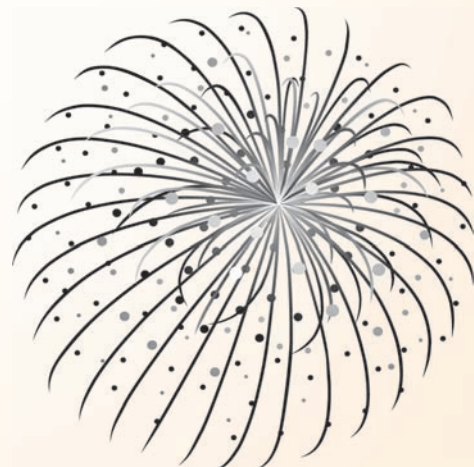


Gift of Life Tree and Bench Dedication Ceremony

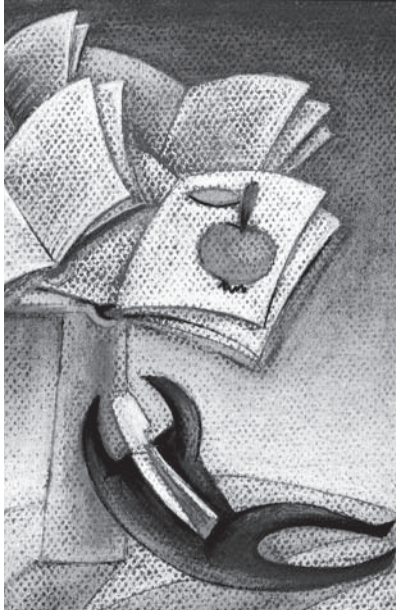

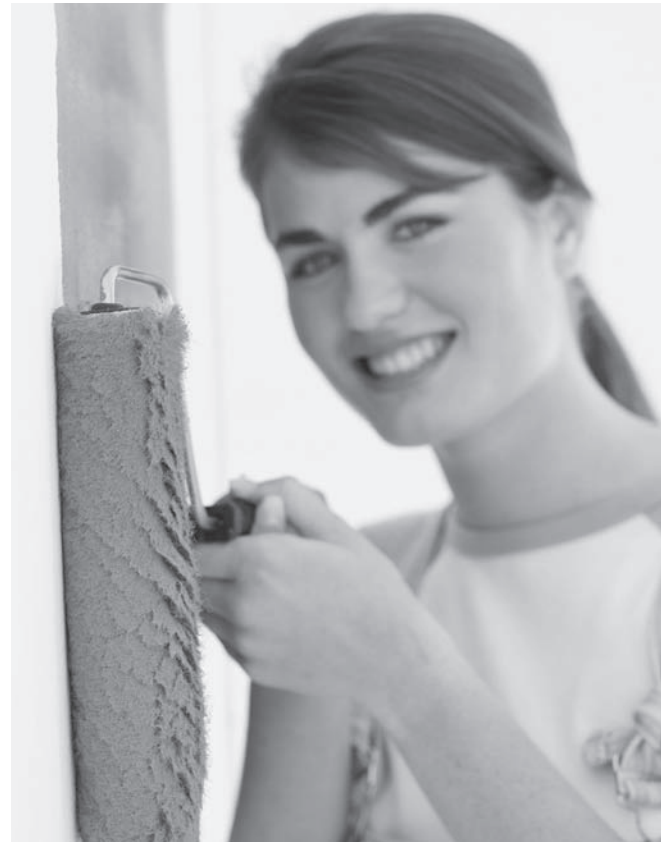

Rent-A-Kid Program

This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist senior citizens in completing routine light-duty household chores, yard work, mowing lawns and shoveling snow. The goal of the **Rent-A-Kid** program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between senior citizens and teenagers.

Senior citizens, age 60 and older, in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for teenagers in their area. It is the responsibility of the senior citizen to contact the teenager and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is \$5 per hour. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the senior citizen to pay, the teenage may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.

Ever wonder what you need to do to close your street and have a neighborhood block party?

During the summer and early fall the office staff often receives calls asking these very questions.

The Board of Supervisors must authorize any closures of township streets (*this does not include state roadways*)

Your request should be submitted in writing, in a timely fashion, to the attention of the township manager.

Please include the following in your request:

1. The date and time of the block party and whether there is a rain date.
2. A drawing showing the exact location and whether there is an alternate route which can be used by motorists while the road is closed.
3. The signature of all property owners adjacent to the section of the affected roadway which you would like to close indicating they have no objection.

If these easy steps are followed, the Board will most likely grant your request. Upon granting such a request, the Board directs that the township public works department drop off barricades which can be used to close the roadway during your block party. The township does request you keep all tables and chairs to one side, so in the event that there would be an emergency situation an ambulance, fire truck or police car, could easily gain access to the area by using the side of the roadway where there are no obstacles.

DO NOT DUMP!

It is illegal to dump anything into the storm sewers located along the streets. Do not dump used oil, gasoline, or grass clippings into the storm sewers.

Smoke Testing Sewer Lines

NOTICE – Manchester Township Public Works Department periodically conducts smoke tests of the sanitary sewer lines. Testing is conducted Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Smoke should not enter premises unless a leak is present. This smoke is non-toxic, non-corrosive, and will not leave a stain. If smoke enters a home, it will soon dissipate. Opening doors and windows will help. Any presence of smoke within the house should be reported to the township office at 764-4646. Avoid unnecessary exposure to the smoke. The smoke is relatively harmless, but all smoke is temporary and quickly disappears after exposure has ceased.



Please Recycle

In addition to weekly trash removal, Manchester Township residents are reminded that in accordance with Pennsylvania Act 101, the following recyclable items are collected on the same day as the regular trash:

GLASS

NEWSPRINT

ALUMINUM/BIMETALS

CARDBOARD

PLASTICS



Reminder!!!

Do **NOT** place trash receptacles at your collection point more than 24 hours before the scheduled collection.

THIS WOULD BE A VIOLATION of section 20-105.1 of the Manchester Township Code of Ordinances. It is also a violation of section 20-210 to steal recyclable materials from recycling containers.



Sewer Backup Claims

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowner's or commercial insurance agent to make sure you carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowner's or commercial property policy. Some homeowner's policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valuable coverage.

The Manchester Township Public Works Dept. will be performing street sweeping throughout the spring. We will try to get to all areas as expeditiously as possible.

Please be cooperative by moving all vehicles from posted streets.

Smoking Safety

- If you smoke, use only fire-safe cigarettes.
- If you smoke, smoke outside. Most deaths result from fires that started in living rooms, family rooms and dens or in bedrooms.
- Keep cigarettes, lighters, matches, and other smoking materials up high out of the reach of children, in a locked cabinet.

Put It Out!

- Use a deep, sturdy ashtray. Place it away from anything that can burn.
- Do not discard cigarettes in vegetation such as mulch, potted plants or landscaping, peat moss, dried grasses, leaves or other things that could ignite easily.
- Before you throw away butts and ashes, make sure they are out, and dousing in water or sand is the best way to do that.



Fire Chief Robert McCoy offers the following ***“Children and Fire Safety Tips”:***

Children playing with fire cause hundreds of deaths and injuries each year. Preschoolers and kindergartners are most likely to start these fires, typically by playing with matches and lighters, and are most likely to die in them.

- Store matches and lighters out of children’s reach and sight, up high, preferably in a locked cabinet.
- Never use lighters or matches as a source of amusement for children; they may imitate you.
- If your child expresses curiosity about fire or has been playing with fire, calmly but firmly explain that matches and lighters are tools for adults only.

- Use only lighters designed with child-resistant features. Remember child-resistant does not mean child proof.
- Teach young children and school-age children to tell an adult if they see matches or lighters.
- Never leave matches or lighters in a bedroom or any place where children may go without supervision.

If Your Clothes Catch Fire

If your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, and roll. Stop immediately, drop to the ground, and cover face with hands. Roll over and over or back and forth to put out the fire. Immediately cool the burn with cool water for 3 to 5 minutes then seek emergency medical care.



Ambulance Service

Manchester Township does NOT offer an ambulance membership or subscription program. In the event that you are transported to a hospital by our ambulance, your health insurance provider or Medicare will be billed for the services rendered. Additionally, the patient is responsible for any service fees not covered by insurance or medicare reimbursements.

Manchester Township Dept. of Fire Services encourages all citizens to keep in mind the following

Summer Grilling Safety Tips:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.

Charcoal grills

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.



Propane grills

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

Water Safety

Know the Facts:

Childhood drownings and near-drownings can happen in a matter of seconds. They typically occur when a child is left unattended or during a brief lapse of supervision. In 2001, 859 children ages 14 and under drowned. For every child that drowns, an additional three receive emergency room treatment for unintentional drowning-related incidents. Severe and permanent brain damage affects as many as 20 percent of near-drowning victims.

Safety Basics

Children should always swim with a grown-up. Every child over the age of three should have swimming lessons. It is important for children to learn and practice water safety rules. Here are some helpful water safety rules for children:

- Swim only if a lifeguard or a grown-up gives you permission.
- Follow the posted rules.
- Check with the lifeguard to find out how deep the water is.
- Always swim with a buddy.
- Never jump or dive unless the lifeguard or a grown-up says it is okay to do so.
- Don't eat candy or chew gum when swimming.
- Never swim at night.
- Get out of the water right away if you hear thunder or see lightning.

Fourth of July

Manchester Township Department of Fire Services reminds our residents that fireworks during the Fourth of July are as American as apple-pie, but did you know that more fires are reported on that day than on any other day of the year in the United States? Nearly half of these fires are caused by fireworks. The good news is you can enjoy your holiday and the fireworks, with just a few simple safety tips:

FACT: Each July Fourth, thousands of people, most often children and teens, are injured while using consumer fireworks.

FACT: The risk of fireworks injury is more than twice as high for children ages 10–14 as for the general population.

PROCEED WITH CAUTION!

- Leave fireworks to the professionals. Do not use consumer fireworks.
- The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals.
- After the firework display, children should never pick up fireworks that may be left over, they may still be active.

How hot does a sparkler burn?

Consumer fireworks include sparklers and firecrackers. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than **1,200 degrees Fahrenheit**, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.

Facts & figures

- The risk of fireworks injury was highest for children ages 5-14, with more than twice the risk for the general population.
- On Independence Day in a typical year, far more U.S. fires are reported than on any other day, and fireworks account for two out of five of those fires, more than any other cause of fires.
- Consumer fireworks include sparklers and firecrackers. Did you know that the tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to cause 3rd degree burns? www.nfpa.org/fireworks
- A report from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) says that there are about 200 fireworks injuries a day during the month surrounding the Fourth of July holiday. Learn more about firework safety here: www.nfpa.org/fireworks

Sparklers, when directly supervised by an adult are the **ONLY** type of fireworks permitted.

Firework displays **require** a special permit.

This presents an especially dangerous situation and it slows the movement of traffic on the streets. PLEASE NOTE THAT PLAYING BASKETBALL IN THE STREET IS A VIOLATION OF THE SECOND CLASS TOWNSHIP CODE THAT STATES "YOU MAY NOT OBSTRUCT ANY PUBLIC STREET OR COMMIT A NUISANCE THEREON"

Please remove your basketball goal from the street edge and keep basketball games out of the public street. Your voluntary removal of these obstructions will be greatly appreciated.

Plan Ahead For Building Permits

All construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, swimming pools, etc), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained **BEFORE** any work can legally be started. This includes inflatable swimming pools over 18" if new or previously removed.

The state law that requires the township to adopt the Uniform Construction Code (UCC) better known as the "building code", allows a municipality up to 15 working days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a completed application is submitted to the municipality. A completed application includes a completely filled out application form, 3 copies of a site plan of the entire lot showing all **existing and proposed** improvements on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and 3 copies of all documentation related to the proposed improvements. Manchester Township strives to process the permits as quickly as possible although during busy times of the year it may take the full 15 days. **NO WORK** can be started until you have a granted permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.

10 things we can do at home:

2. Never dump anything down storm drains or in streams.
3. Vegetate bare spots in your yard.
4. Compost your yard waste.
5. Use least toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems.
6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture runoff.
7. Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
8. Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil.
9. Pick up after your pet.
10. Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly.

Tips from your Tax Collector

It's tax time again and I'd like to remind you to **please write a contact phone number on your check**. Unlisted phone numbers make it difficult to reach you if there is a question or problem with your check, resulting in missed rebates and late payments. If you need a receipt, include both halves of the bill with a self-addressed stamped envelope when paying.

The rebate period for 2013 County/Township payments ends at midnight on April 15, 2013. The window will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on April 15th for last minute payments. Any payments received in the "Tax Collector" night slot (located outside the Township Building on the brick wall) on the morning of April 16th will be considered paid at rebate. **Please do not ask me to break the law and accept payments after the deadline.**

I receive many requests for changes to the homeowner information on the tax bills. For your protection, I am not able to change the name printed on your tax notice. The name on the tax bill comes from the York County deed database. If you'd like to change your name due to marriage, etc. it must be changed at the Recorder of Deeds office. I can remove a deceased spouse's name from the bill with a copy of the death certificate.

WEST NILE

How can you reduce the number of mosquitoes around your home and neighborhood?

Mosquitoes breed in standing water. Even a small bucket that has stagnant water in it for seven days can become home to up to 1,000 mosquitoes. Here are some easy tips to eliminate standing water:

- a. Dispose of tin cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots or similar water holding containers that have accumulated on your property. Do not overlook containers that have become overgrown by aquatic vegetation.
- b. Pay special attention to discarded tires that may have accumulated on your property.
- c. Drill holes in the bottom of recycling containers that are left out of doors. Drainage holes that are located on the container sides collect enough water for mosquitoes to breed in.
- d. Clean clogged roof gutters on an annual basis, particularly if the leaves from surrounding trees have a tendency to plug up the drains. Roof gutters are easily overlooked but can produce millions of mosquitoes each season.
- e. Turn over plastic wading pools when not in use. A wading pool becomes a mosquito producer if it is not used on a regular basis.
- f. Turn over wheelbarrows and do not allow water to stagnate in birdbaths. Both provide breeding habitat for domestic mosquitoes.
- g. Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish. Water gardens are fashionable but become major mosquito producers if they are allowed to stagnate. Clean and chlorinate swimming pools that are not being used. A swimming pool that is left untended by a family that goes on vacation for a month can produce enough mosquitoes to result in neighborhood-wide complaints. Be aware that mosquitoes may even breed in the water that collects on swimming pool covers.

If you **do not want** solicitors, you must post a sign at least 3"X5" with letters no less than 1/3" in height near the main entrance of your residence. Sign must read "**NO SOLICITORS**". Each residence must be posted; signs at entrance to developments are not permitted or enforced.

Nuisance Ordinance

Per Ordinance #2007-01, don't place basketball hoops or other sporting equipment in roadway or in road right-of-way so play can occur in the street.

The following are strictly prohibited and declared a nuisance:

- The placing of mulch, stone, dirt or building materials from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.
- Basketball hoops or other sports equipment within the street or road right-of-way.
- Detached trailers or storage units within the cartway.
- Dumping of any substances (oil, grass, etc.) into any storm sewer.

Stone or brick mailboxes require a road occupancy permit before construction.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with these provisions may be fined up to \$600.00 per day.
