
Attention Bus Trip Participants

Manchester Township Residents will receive preference on all bus trips up to 45 days prior to the trip. Non-Residents may sign up immediately, however, they will be placed on a waiting list until the 45th day, at which time, any remaining seats will be filled 1st come, 1st served. There is no limit to the number of seats residents may reserve.

A **\$5.00 non-refundable deposit** will reserve your seat for all bus trips unless otherwise noted.

FINAL PAYMENT IS DUE 5 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE TRIP!

Please note that refunds on cancelled seat(s) for bus trips will not be issued unless a **written cancellation** is received **at least two (2) weeks prior** to the trip and **only if the cancelled seat(s) are filled** by another party. The \$5.00 deposit is non-refundable.



Motorized Vehicles at Township Parks

Please observe Park Rule #12 when using all township parks:

Smoking at any Manchester Township park is prohibited in the following areas:


- Stage area at Cousler Park.



Ever wonder what you need to do to close your street and have a neighborhood block party?

During the summer and early fall the office staff often receives calls asking these very questions.

The Board of Supervisors must authorize any closures of township streets (*this does not include state roadways*)

Your request should be submitted in writing, in a timely fashion, to the attention of the township manager.

Please include the following in your request:

1. The date and time of the block party, & whether there is a rain date.
2. A drawing showing the exact location and whether there is an alternate route which can be used by motorists while the road is closed.
3. The signature of all property owners adjacent to the section of the affected road way which you would like to close indicating they have no objection.



If these easy steps are followed, the Board will most likely grant your request. Upon granting such a request, the Board directs that the township public works department drop off barricades which can be used to close the roadway during your block party. The township does request you keep all tables and chairs to one side, so in the event that there would be an emergency situation an ambulance, fire truck or police car, could easily gain access to the area by using the side of the roadway where there are no obstacles.

TREE TRIMMING

On January 6, 2014 the Manchester Township Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance #2014-01, establishing regulations which require property owners to maintain clearance of trees and similar vegetation from the street cartway (curb-to-curb) to a height above the cart way of fourteen feet (14'). Upon notification of a violation, the property owner shall have 30 days to correct the violation prior to being subject to penalties. Ordinance #2014-01 is available for review on the township web site www.mantwp.com.

FEMA Regulations – Flood Plains

Through FEMA, the Federal Government requires that any building or improvement located within a mapped flood area have flood insurance. FEMA has recently updated these maps, using newer technology and topographic information to better map floods. The result of this update is that the mapped flood areas have changed in many instances, either increasing or decreasing. This may affect your property and your need for flood insurance. These maps are available online at the link below. They are also available at the Township office for review. The new maps are not yet in effect, and property owners have an opportunity now to inspect the maps. Should property owners disagree with the mapped flood areas, they can file an appeal, which must be supported with engineering calculations. These appeals must be filed to FEMA before May 6, 2014.

Sewer Backup Claims

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowner’s or commercial insurance agent to make sure you carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowner’s or commercial property policy. Some homeowner’s policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valuable coverage.

NOTICE

Smoke should not enter premises unless a leak is present. This smoke is non-toxic, non-corrosive, and will not leave a stain. If smoke enters a home, it will soon dissipate. Opening doors and windows will help. Any presence of smoke within the house should be reported to the township office at 764-4646. Avoid unnecessary exposure to the smoke. The smoke is relatively harmless, but all smoke is temporary and quickly disappears after exposure has ceased.

Smoke Testing Sewer Lines

Manchester Township Public Works Department periodically conducts smoke tests of the sanitary sewer lines. Testing is conducted Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.



Smoking Safety

- If you smoke, use only fire-safe cigarettes.
- If you smoke, smoke outside. Most deaths result from fires that started in living rooms, family rooms and dens or in bedrooms.
- Keep cigarettes, lighters, matches, and other smoking materials up high out of the reach of children, in a locked cabinet.

Put It Out!

- Use a deep, sturdy ashtray. Place it away from anything that can burn.
- Do not discard cigarettes in vegetation such as mulch, potted plants or landscaping, peat moss, dried grasses, leaves or other things that could ignite easily.
- Before you throw away butts and ashes, make sure they are out, and dousing in water or sand is the best way to do that.



Fourth of July

Manchester Township Department of Fire Services reminds our residents that fireworks during the Fourth of July are as American as apple-pie, but did you know that more fires are reported on that day than on any other day of the year in the United States? Nearly half of these fires are caused by fireworks. The good news is you can enjoy your holiday and the fireworks, with just a few simple safety tips:

FACT: Each July Fourth, thousands of people, most often children and teens, are injured while using consumer fireworks.

FACT: The risk of fireworks injury is more than twice as high for children ages 10–14 as for the general population.

PROCEED WITH CAUTION!

- Leave fireworks to the professionals. Do not use consumer fireworks.
- The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals.
- After the firework display, children should never pick up fireworks that may be left over, they may still be active.

How hot does a sparkler burn?

Consumer fireworks include sparklers and firecrackers. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.

FIREWORKS

Questions regarding personal use of fireworks or sparklers, contact the Department of Fire Services at 717-767-1954.

Sparklers, when directly supervised by an adult are the **ONLY** type of fireworks permitted.

Firework displays **require** a special permit.

Ambulance Service

Additionally, the patient is responsible for any service fees not covered by insurance or medicare reimbursements.

Water Safety

The Emergency Personnel at MTDFS encourages all citizens to keep in mind that childhood drowning and near drowning can happen in a matter of seconds. They typically occur when a child is left unattended or during a brief lapse of supervision. Severe and permanent brain damage affects as many as 20 percent of near-drowning victims. Make sure your family is safe around water.

Safety basics:


- Make sure pools and spas are enclosed on four sides with a fence at least 4 feet high with a self-closing and latching gates. (or are above ground with 4' high walls.)
- Drains in pools and spas should have anti-entrapment drain covers.
- Learn infant and child CPR and always have a phone near the pool for emergency use.
- Children should always swim under the supervision of a grown-up. Every child over the age of three should have swimming lessons.
- Children using air-filled swimming aids should always be supervised by an adult within arm's reach.
- U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejacket should be worn for water sports such as tubing, skiing or jet skiing. Air-filled aids such as inner tubes, water wings and inflatable rafts are not substitutes for approved lifejackets

It is important for children to learn and practice water safety rules. Here are some helpful water safety rules for children:

- Children should swim only if a lifeguard or a grown-up gives you permission.
- Teach children to obey the posted rules.

Encourage children to:

- Get out of the water right away if you hear thunder or see lightning.
- When on a boat, everyone needs a seat and his or her own U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejacket.
- Never jump or dive unless the lifeguard or a grown-up says it is okay to do so.
- Check with the lifeguard to find out how deep the water is.
- Always swim with a buddy.
- Don't eat candy or chew gum when swimming.
- Never swim at night.

PAYMENT OF SEWER ACCOUNTS

Manchester Township does not provide for automatic deduction of quarterly sewer invoices from customer bank accounts.

However, please check with your bank, as they may have a bill payer service which you could use to automatically pay your sewer invoice.

RENT-A-KID

This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students, in grades 7 through 12, to assist senior citizens in completing routine light-duty household chores, yard work, mowing lawns and shoveling snow. The goal of the **Rent-A-Kid** program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between senior citizens and teenagers.

Senior citizens, age 60 and older, in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for teenagers in their area. It is the responsibility of the senior citizen to contact the teenager and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is \$5 per hour. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the senior citizen to pay, the teenage may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.

ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE

Ordinance #2009-05

On November 10, 2009 the Board of Supervisors adopted an animal control ordinance which is intended to encourage the proper safe care and management of animals within Manchester Township.

Please note that this ordinance addresses the keeping of domestic animals, as well as feral cat(s), and requires that anyone “keeping” a feral cat or cats, must see that they have been trapped, neutered and released (TNR) back into the wild.

The York County SPCA (717-764-6109) or Manchester Township's animal enforcement officer, Ellis Wildlife (717-266-1712), can provide assistance with feral cats.

NOT IN THE STREET!

Playing basketball in the street is an accident waiting to happen. With players running and jumping on asphalt surfaces surrounded by curbing (at times), parked and moving cars, someone is going to get hurt. There are a number of portable basketball goals being set up along the street in Manchester Township. This presents an especially dangerous situation and it slows the movement of traffic on the streets. Basketball goals also present a problem with the township's street maintenance program including street sweeping and garbage collection.

PLEASE NOTE THAT PLAYING BASKETBALL IN THE STREET IS A VIOLATION OF THE SECOND CLASS TOWNSHIP CODE THAT STATES "YOU MAY NOT OBSTRUCT ANY PUBLIC STREET OR COMMIT A NUISANCE THEREON"

Please remove your basketball goal from the street edge and keep basketball games out of the public street. Your voluntary removal of these obstructions will be greatly appreciated.

Slow Down...

The spring weather will bring some added dangers while driving in residential areas. Young children are playing outdoors, walkers, bikers, runners, and other pedestrians will also be out in force. Are you driving too fast for conditions?

The Northern York County Regional Police Department receives several complaints each week in regards to vehicles exceeding the speed limit in numerous neighborhoods. Please be mindful of your speed and the inherent dangers while driving through the neighborhood.

The Board of Supervisors and police department jointly ask you to please eliminate the risks inherent with speeding vehicles by slowing down.

DO NOT DUMP!

It is illegal to dump anything into the storm sewers located along the streets. Do not dump used oil, gasoline, or grass clippings into the storm sewers.

Reminder!!!

Do **NOT** place trash receptacles at your collection point more than 24 hours before the scheduled collection.

THIS WOULD BE A VIOLATION of section 20-105.1 of the Manchester Township Code of Ordinances. It is also a violation of section 20-210 to steal recyclable materials from recycling containers.

Plan Ahead For Building Permits

All construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, swimming pools, etc), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained **BEFORE** any work can legally be started. This includes inflatable swimming pools over 18" if new or previously removed.

State law requires the township to adopt the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), better known as the "building code". The UCC allows a municipality up to 15 working days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a completed application is submitted to the municipality. A completed application includes a completely filled out application form, 3 copies of a site plan for the entire lot showing all **existing and proposed** improvements on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and 3 copies of all documentation related to the proposed improvements. Manchester Township strives to process the permits as quickly as possible although during busy times of the year it may take the full 15 working days. **NO WORK** can be started until you have a granted permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.

Tips from your Tax Collector

It's tax time again and I'd like to remind you to **please write a contact phone number on your check**. Unlisted phone numbers make it difficult to reach you if there is a question or problem with your check, resulting in missed rebates and late payments.

The rebate period for 2014 County/Township payments ends at midnight on April 15, 2014. The office window will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday April 15th for last minute payments. Any payments received in the night drop box on the morning of April 16th will be considered paid at rebate. **Please do not ask me to break the law and accept payments after the deadline.**

I receive many requests for changes to the homeowner information on the tax bills. Please note, for your protection, I am not able to change the name printed on your tax notice. The name on the tax bill comes from the York County deed database. If you'd like to change your name due to marriage, etc. it must be changed at the Recorder of Deeds office. The only exception is I can remove a deceased spouse's name from the bill at the surviving spouses' request.

WEST NILE

How can you reduce the number of mosquitoes around your home and neighborhood?

Mosquitoes breed in standing water. Even a small bucket that has stagnant water in it for seven days can become home to up to 1,000 mosquitoes. Here are some easy tips to eliminate standing water:

- Dispose of tin cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots or similar water holding containers that have accumulated on your property. Do not overlook containers that have become overgrown by aquatic vegetation.
- Pay special attention to discarded tires that may have accumulated on your property.
- Drill holes in the bottom of recycling containers that are left out of doors. Drainage holes that are located on the container sides collect enough water for mosquitoes to breed in.
- Clean clogged roof gutters on an annual basis, particularly if the leaves from surrounding trees have a tendency to plug up the drains. Roof gutters are easily overlooked but can produce millions of mosquitoes each season.
- Turn over plastic wading pools when not in use. A wading pool becomes a mosquito producer if it is not used on a regular basis.
- Turn over wheelbarrows and do not allow water to stagnate in birdbaths. Both provide breeding habitat for domestic mosquitoes.
- Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish. Water gardens are fashionable but become major mosquito producers if they are allowed to stagnate. Clean and chlorinate swimming pools that are not being used. A swimming pool that is left untended by a family that goes on vacation for a month can produce enough mosquitoes to result in neighborhood-wide complaints. Be aware that mosquitoes may even breed in the water that collects on swimming pool covers.

If you **do not want** solicitors, you must post a sign at least 3"X5" with letters no less than 1/3" in height near the main entrance of your residence. Sign must read "**NO SOLICITORS**". Each residence must be posted; signs at entrance to developments are not permitted or enforced.

Nuisance Ordinance

Per Ordinance #2007-01, don't place basketball hoops or other sporting equipment in roadway or in road right-of-way so play can occur in the street.

The following are strictly prohibited and declared a nuisance:

- The placing of mulch, stone, dirt or building materials from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.
- Basketball hoops or other sports equipment within the street or road right-of-way.
- Detached trailers or storage units within the cartway.
- Dumping of any substances (oil, grass, etc.) into any storm sewer.

Stone or brick mailboxes require a road occupancy permit before construction.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with these provisions may be fined up to \$600.00 per day.

Penna. Act 229 of 2002, portions of which became effective on February 21, 2003, requires motorists to turn their headlights on when driving through a posted work zone.

Additionally, Act 229 establishes penalties for a motorist convicted of exceeding the work zone speed limit by 11 miles or more per hour by having his or her license suspended for 15 days.
