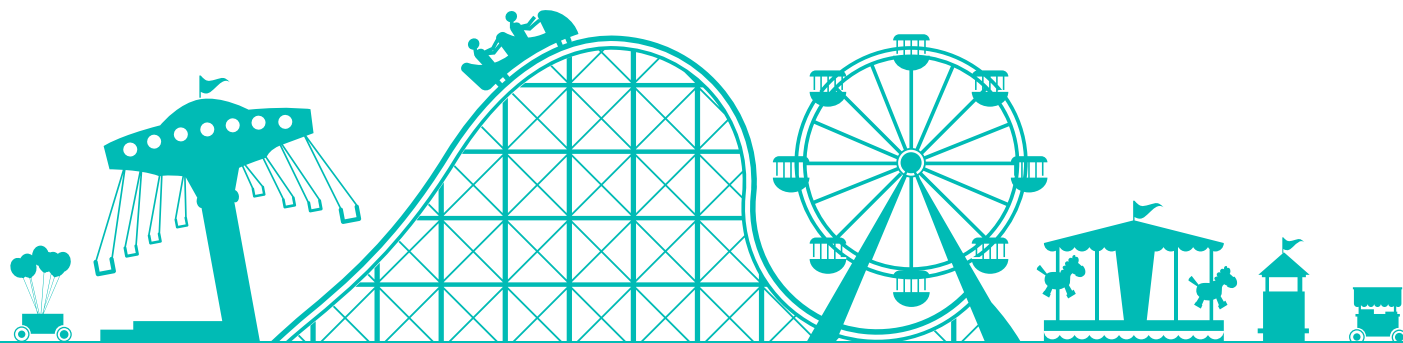

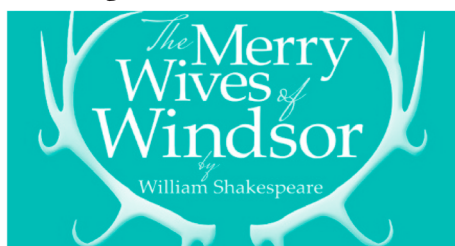

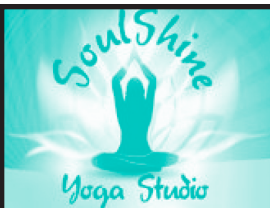

Items will need to be placed at curbside by 6:00 am.

“Yard Waste” materials are defined as tree trimmings, shrubbery and any other organic landscape vegetation, **excluding grass clippings**.

Materials should be packaged as follows:

- Place items in either Biodegradable Kraft bags or tied in easily handled bundles.
- Bundles should be no longer than four (4) feet in length.
- Bundles should not weigh more than 30 lbs. each.
- Branches should not exceed 6 inches in diameter.

The following items should **not** be placed out for Yard Waste Collection:

- Leaf Waste (Note: Manchester Township provides this service)
- Dirt or Stones
- Fruits and/or Vegetables
- Any material in a Plastic Bag

TREE TRIMMING

Property owners are required to maintain clearance of trees and similar vegetation from the street cartway (curb to curb) to a height above the cartway of fourteen feet (14'). Upon notification of a violation, the property owner shall have 30 days to correct the violation prior to being subject to penalties.

How can you reduce the number of mosquitoes around your home and neighborhood?

Mosquitoes breed in standing water. Even a small bucket that has stagnant water in it for seven days can become home to up to 1,000 mosquitoes. Here are some easy tips to eliminate standing water:

- Dispose of tin cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots or similar water holding containers that have accumulated on your property. Do not overlook containers that have become overgrown by aquatic vegetation.
- Pay special attention to discarded tires that may have accumulated on your property.
- Drill holes in the bottom of recycling containers that are left out of doors. Drainage holes that are located on the container sides collect enough water for mosquitoes to breed in.
- Clean clogged roof gutters on an annual basis, particularly if the leaves from surrounding trees have a tendency to plug up the drains. Roof gutters are easily overlooked but can produce millions of mosquitoes each season.
- Turn over plastic wading pools when not in use. A wading pool becomes a mosquito producer if it is not used on a regular basis.
- Turn over wheelbarrows and do not allow water to stagnate in birdbaths. Both provide breeding habitat for domestic mosquitoes.
- Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish. Water gardens are fashionable but become major mosquito producers if they are allowed to stagnate. Clean and chlorinate swimming pools that are not being used. A swimming pool that is left untended by a family that goes on vacation for a month can produce enough mosquitoes to result in neighborhood-wide complaints. Be aware that mosquitoes may even breed in the water that collects on swimming pool covers.

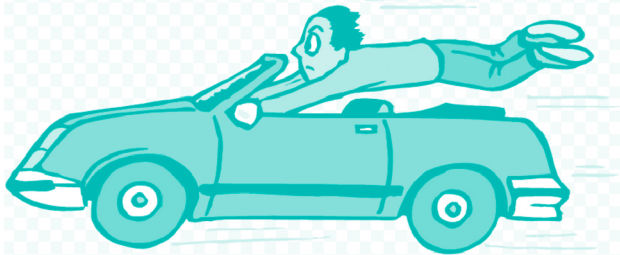

NUISANCE ORDINANCE

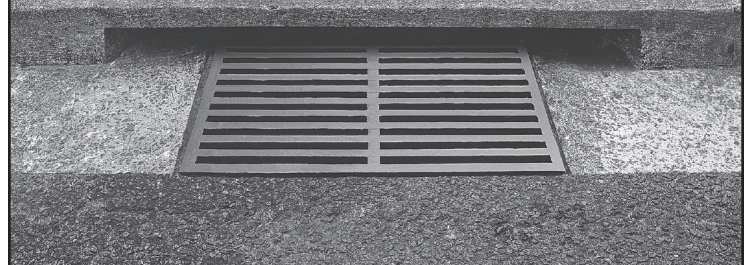
The following are strictly prohibited and declared a nuisance by township ordinance:

1. The placing of mulch, stone, dirt or building materials from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.
2. Basketball hoops or other sports equipment within the street or road right-of-way.
3. Detached trailers or storage units within the cartway
4. Dumping of any substances (oil, grass, etc.) into any storm sewer

Stone or brick mailboxes require a road occupancy permit before construction.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with these provisions may be fined up to \$600.00 per day.

THE DRAIN IS JUST FOR RAIN



It is illegal to dump anything into the storm sewers located along the streets. Do not dump used oil, gasoline, or grass clippings into the storm sewers.

Lets Have A Neighborhood Block Party

HOW? A few simple steps will allow you to close your street for some fun.

Your request should be submitted in writing, in a timely fashion, to the attention of the township manager.

Please include the following in your request:

1. The date and time of the block party & whether there is a rain date.
2. A drawing showing the exact location and whether there is an alternate route which can be used by motorists while the road is closed.
3. The signature of all property owners adjacent to the section of the affected roadway which you would like to close indicating they have no objection.

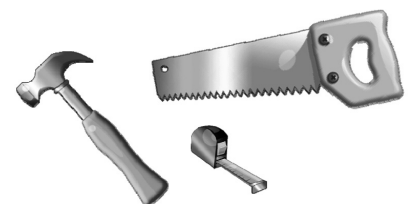
The Board of Supervisors must authorize any closures of township streets (*this does not include state roadways*)

Once these steps are followed, the Board will most likely grant your request. Upon granting such a request, the Board directs that the township public works department drop off barricades which can be used to close the roadway during your block party. The township does request you keep all tables and chairs to one side, so in the event that there would be an emergency situation an ambulance, fire truck or police car, could easily gain access to the area by using the side of the roadway where there are no obstacles.

PLAN AHEAD FOR BUILDING PERMITS

All construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, swimming pools, etc), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained **BEFORE** any work can legally be started. This includes inflatable swimming pools over 18" if new or previously removed.

State law requires the township to adopt the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), better known as the "building code". The UCC allows a municipality up to 15 working days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a completed application is submitted to the municipality. A completed application includes a completely filled out application form, 3 copies of a site plan for the entire lot showing all **existing and proposed** improvements on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and 3 copies of all documentation related to the proposed improvements. Manchester Township strives to process the permits as quickly as possible although during busy times of the year it may take the full 15 working days. **NO WORK** can be started until you have a granted permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.



STORM WATER MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Any building or zoning permit application that proposes any new impervious area must first satisfy the requirements of the storm water management ordinance.

Ultimately it is the property owners' responsibility to control runoff from their property.

This requirement is a mandate from the United States Environmental Protection Agency EPA, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection DEP and the County of York. Manchester Township passed Ordinance 2012-05 in order to comply with the mandate. Failure to comply with the mandates would subject the township as a whole to penalties from either DEP and/or EPA.

Put simply, if property owner builds or places on their lot something that covers the ground so that rainwater cannot penetrate or that will not allow grass to grow something must be done to allow the runoff to soak into the ground under a *normal* rain condition.

Anyone applying for a Building or Zoning Permit is required to address the storm water runoff from any new impervious area to be installed or placed on any lot.

You will need to know the measurements of all structures, patios, sidewalks, swimming pools and paving, existing and proposed, on your lot in order obtain a storm water permit to meet these requirements **BEFORE** a building or zoning permit will be able to be issued.

The Home Delivered Meals Program is designed to provide a well-balanced daily meal to homebound older adults who are unable to prepare adequate meals for themselves and have no other means for assuring healthful nutrition.

On Monday, Wednesday and Friday, a hot meal is delivered to the older adult's home. Tuesday and Thursday meals are a cold bag lunch delivered with the previous day's hot meal.

Volunteers from the local senior center deliver the meals to the older adult's home. The Northeastern Senior Center is seeking volunteers for home delivered meals, please call **717-266-1400** if interested. Although this is a brief contact it does provide a check on the well being of the homebound individual. The home delivered meal service is not a cost shared service.

Monetary donations can be made to the York County Area Agency on Aging.

Care managers need to complete an in-home assessment to determine eligibility for Home Delivered Meals.

Eligibility for Home Delivered Meals

To be eligible for Home Delivered Meals services an individual must be:

- A York County resident in a non-institutional setting.
- 60 years of age or older.
- Have a physical, mental or emotional disability, which prohibits the individual from leaving his/her residence on a regular basis and/or prevents them from preparing a nutritious meal.
- Living alone or with someone who also meets the above criteria.

SEWER BACKUP CLAIMS

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowner's or commercial insurance agent to make sure you carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowner's or commercial property policy. Some homeowner's policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valuable coverage.

NOT IN THE STREET!



Playing basketball in the street is an accident waiting to happen. With players running and jumping on asphalt surfaces surrounded by curbing (at times), parked and moving cars someone is going to get hurt. There are a number of portable basketball goals being set up along the street in Manchester Township. This presents an especially dangerous situation and it slows the movement of traffic on the streets. Basketball goals also present a problem with the township's street maintenance program including street sweeping and garbage collection.

PLEASE NOTE THAT PLAYING BASKETBALL IN THE STREET IS A VIOLATION OF THE SECOND CLASS TOWNSHIP CODE THAT STATES "YOU MAY NOT OBSTRUCT ANY PUBLIC STREET OR COMMIT A NUISANCE THEREON"

Please remove your basketball goal from the street edge and keep basketball games out of the public street. Your voluntary removal of these obstructions will be greatly appreciated.

ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE

In 2009 the Manchester Township Board of Supervisors adopted an animal control ordinance which addresses the keeping of domestic animals, as well as feral cat(s), and requires that anyone "keeping" a feral cat or cats, must see that they have been trapped, neutered and released (TNR) back into the wild.

The York County SPCA (717-764-6109) or Manchester Township's animal enforcement officer, Michelle Klugh (Klugh Animal Control) 717-916-1413 can provide assistance with feral cats.

Tax Reform Brings Fire Sprinkler Incentives

While smoke alarms are essential in alerting occupants to a fire, it is not uncommon for some people to sleep through alarms. Fire sprinklers help save lives by minimizing the spread of a fire, allowing more time for occupants to respond to alarms and escape safely. They also reduce smoke and fire damage in a building. Most sprinkler systems activate when the heat from a fire melts a fusible link in the sprinkler head or heads closest to the fire. Contrary to what you see on television and in the movies, sprinkler systems do not activate by smoke, and not all sprinkler heads throughout a building activate at once. Only those exposed to the highest heat will activate.

The passage of tax reform legislation by Congress this past December brought many changes for both businesses and individuals. This legislation included two great incentives for businesses to install fire sprinklers in their commercial structures. The two fire sprinkler incentives are found in the Cost Recover Section 13201 and Small Business Section 179 Expensing.

In the Cost Recover Section 13201, any new sprinkler system installed between September 27, 2017 and December 31, 2022 in either a commercial or residential structure until will be fully expensed. Thus, the homeowner or business can immediately write off the full cost of the sprinkler system. After 2022, installation write-offs begin to scale back each year for 5 years, then in 2027 will revert to previous rules.

Fire Protection has been added as an eligible expense under Small Business Section 179. In addition, the amount small business can deduct in a single year under this section has increased to \$1 million. This only applies to commercial structures and not residential structures.

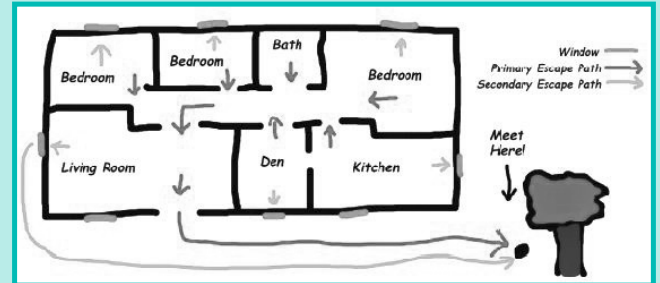

IN CASE OF FIRE

Follow Your Escape Plan!

**Remember to GET OUT, STAY OUT and CALL 9-1-1
or your local emergency phone number.**

- If closed doors or handles are warm, use your second way out. Never open doors that are warm to the touch.
- Crawl low under smoke.
- Go to your outside meeting place and then call for help.
- If smoke, heat or flames block your exit routes, stay in the room with doors closed. Place a wet towel under the door and call the fire department or 9-1-1. Open a window and wave a brightly colored cloth or flashlight to signal for help.



Use Caution with Fire Extinguishers

Use a portable fire extinguisher ONLY if you have been trained by the fire department and in the following conditions:

- The fire is confined to a small area, and is not growing.
- The room is not filled with smoke.
- Everyone has exited the building.
- The fire department has been called.

Remember the word PASS when using a fire extinguisher.

- **P**ull the pin and hold the extinguisher with the nozzle pointing away from you.
- **A**im low. Point the extinguisher at the base of the fire.
- **S**queeze the lever slowly and evenly.
- **S**weep the nozzle from side to side

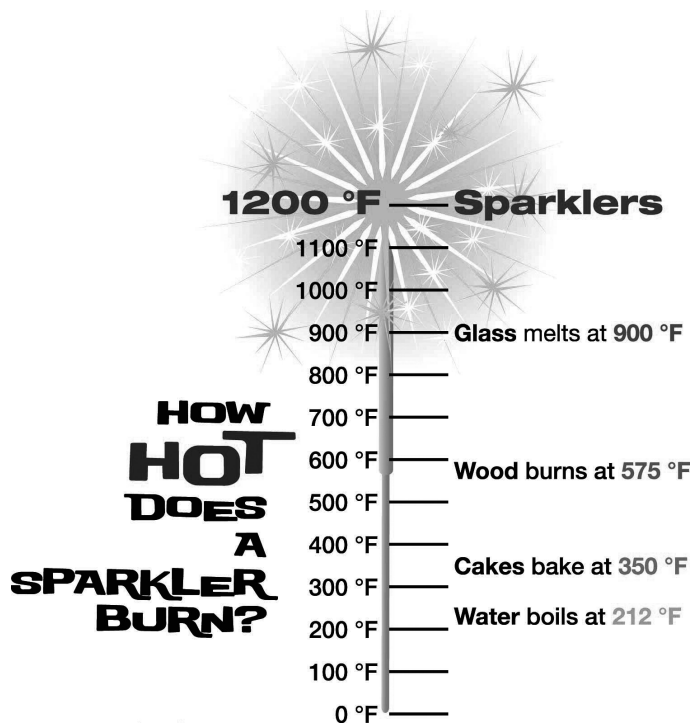

FIRE SAFETY TIPS



During outside use of flammable liquids, the wind can unexpectedly change direction causing vapors to blow toward you when lighting a fire. Make sure you have completely closed the flammable liquid container and it is away from the area before you light a fire.

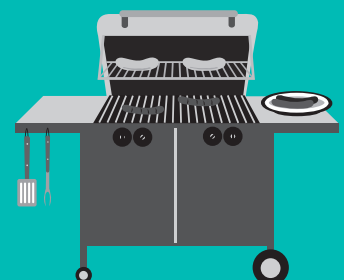


PROPANE GRILLS

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If you grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill.

FACTS

- ! July is the peak month for grill fires.
- ! More than half of home grill structure fires begin on either a courtyard terrace or patio, or an exterior balcony or open porch.
- ! Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

Tips for Safety In and Around Water

Water safety awareness is something everyone should be concerned about all year long. It takes only inches of water for a small child to drown so taking extra safety steps at home and around pools, spas and all bodies of water can prevent drowning incidents.

Some facts about young children and drowning:

- The majority of deaths and injuries in pools and spas involve children ages 1-2 and occur in residential settings.
- Drowning is the leading cause of unintentional death to children ages 1-4
- Drowning occurs when there is a short lapse in adult supervision
- Little children drown quickly and silently

The following safety tips can help to keep children safe.

Rule # 1: Never leave a child unattended around a pool, spa, bath tub or any body of water

At pools, spas and other recreational waters:

- Teach children basic water safety skills.
- Learn how to swim and ensure your children know how to swim as well.
- Avoid entrapment by keeping children away from pool drains, pipes and other openings.
- Have a phone close by at all times when visiting a pool or spa.
- If a child is missing, look for them in the pool or spa first, including neighbors' pools or spas.
- Share safety instructions with family, friends, babysitters and neighbors.

If you have a pool:

- Install a 4-foot fence around the perimeter of the pool and spa, including portable pools.
- Use self-closing and self-latching gates; ask neighbors to do the same if they have pools or spas.
- If your house serves as the fourth side of a fence around a pool, install and use a door or pool alarm.
- Maintain pool and spa covers in good working order.
- Ensure any pool or spa you use has compliant drain covers; ask if you do not know.
- Have lifesaving equipment such as life rings, floats or a reaching pole available and easily accessible

At home:

- Always keep a young child within arm's reach in a bathtub. If you must leave, take the child with you.
- Don't leave a baby or young child in a bathtub under the care of another young child.
- Never leave a bucket or basin containing even a small amount of liquid unattended. Always empty and store buckets where young children cannot reach them.
- Consider placing locks on toilet seat covers in case a young child wanders into the bathroom.

I understand that I am also responsible for notifying my municipality if I change my address or health status.

The smoke is relatively harmless, but all smoke is temporary and quickly disappears after exposure has ceased.
