

Budget Adopted

2015 Budget Adopted

On December 9, 2014 the Board adopted the 2015 operating budget. The budget includes a \$10,238,530. General Fund and \$3,214,750 in other funds for a total of \$13,452,280.

Real Estate tax millage remains at 1.00 mills, and the fee toward refuse/recycling collection increases to \$38.00/per quarter effective April 1, 2015.



As part of the adoption of the 2015 township budget, the Manchester Township Board of Supervisors have authorized an increase of refuse/recycling fees to directly relate to the actual costs of curbside pickup. The actual costs in 2015 for refuse/recycling is \$152.00 annually per residence. Currently, residents pay \$100.00 annually toward the costs of residential refuse/recycling. Beginning the second quarter (April 2015), sewer/refuse bills will reflect an increase in the refuse/ recycling fee from \$25.00 per quarter to \$38.00 per quarter, which relates directly to the actual costs associated with refuse/recycling. Reminder!!!

Do **NOT** place trash receptacles at your collection point **more than 24 hours** before the scheduled collection.

This would be a violation of Section 20-105.1 of the Manchester Township Code of Ordinances.

It is also a violation of Section 20-210 to steal recyclable materials from recycling containers.

TREE TRIMMING Ordinance #2014-01

On January 6, 2014 the Manchester Township Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance #2014-01, establishing regulations which require property owners to maintain clearance of trees and similar vegetation from the street cart way (curb to curb) to a height above the cart way of fourteen (14) feet. Upon notification of a violation, the property owner shall have **30 days** to correct the violation prior to being subject to penalties.

Items will need to be placed at curbside by 6:00 am.

"Yard Waste" materials are defined as tree trimmings, shrubbery and any other organic landscape vegetation, **excluding** grass clippings.

Materials should be packaged as follows:

- Place items in either Biodegradable Kraft bags or tied in easily handled bundles.
- Bundles should be no longer than four (4) feet in length.
- Bundles should not weigh more than 30 lbs. each.
- Branches should not exceed 6 inches in diameter.

The following items should not be placed out for Yard Waste Collection:

- Leaf Waste (Note: Manchester Township provides this service)
- Dirt or Stones
- Fruits and/or Vegetables
- Any material in a Plastic Bag

If you are a person with a disability and wish to attend any township meetings, please contact the office at least **three (3)** business days **prior** to discuss how your needs may be served.

Tips from your Tax Collector

County/Township property tax bills will be mailed on February 14, 2015. If you do not receive a bill, please contact the tax office immediately. Payments at discount will be accepted through April 15, 2015. Window hours are Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, 12:00 pm – 3:00 pm, except for holidays. Special hours for the discount date will be included with your tax bill. As always, **please write a contact phone number on your check!** Unlisted phone numbers make it difficult to reach you if there is a question or problem with your check.

Pennsylvania offers a Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program to help defray the cost of real estate taxes. The program is available to individuals 65 and older, widows/widowers age 50 and older and people with disabilities over 18. Please check with your tax preparer to see if you meet the income requirements to benefit from this program. If eligible, you must include "stamped" copies of your 2014 tax bills as proof of payment with your application. Contact the tax office if you need stamped receipts.

For your protection, we are not able to change the name printed on your tax notice. The name on the tax bill comes from the York County deed database. If you'd like to change your name due to marriage, etc. it must be changed at the Recorder of Deeds office. The only exception is we can remove a deceased spouse's name from the bill at the surviving spouse's request.

SEWER BACKUP CLAIMS

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowner's or commercial insurance agent to make sure you carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowner's or commercial property policy. Some homeowner's policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valuable coverage.

Newspapers, magazines, junk mail, etc. must be bundled or placed in brown paper bags. #1 - #7 containers & bottles can also be recycled.



REMINDER: Turn Your Headlights On!

Penna. Act 229 of 2002

Penna. Act 229 of 2002, portions of which became effective on February 21, 2003, requires motorists to turn their headlights on when driving through a posted work zone.

Additionally, Act 229 establishes penalties for a motorist convicted of exceeding the work zone speed limit by 11 miles or more per hour by having his or her license suspended for 15 days.



This program provides an opportunity for middle and high school students to assist senior citizens in completing routine light-duty household chores, yard work, mowing lawns and shoveling snow. The goal of the **Rent-A-Kid** program is not only to get an important job done, but also to foster friendships between senior citizens and teenagers.

Senior citizens, age 60 and older, in need of assistance with chores can call the Rent-A-Kid coordinator who will provide names and phone numbers for teenagers (**Grades 7-12**) in their area. It is the responsibility of the senior citizen to contact the teenager and discuss the job to be done, when it is to be done, the rate of pay for the job, and any other arrangements that need to be made.

Recommended pay rate is \$5 per hour. However, depending on the type of work and the ability of the senior citizen to pay, the teenage may negotiate a more satisfactory rate of pay.

Home Delivered Meals

Monday thru Friday 11:00 am – 1:00 pm

The Home Delivered Meals Program is designed to provide a wellbalanced daily meal to homebound older adults who are unable to prepare adequate meals for themselves and have no other means for assuring healthful nutrition.

On Monday, Wednesday and Friday, a hot meal is delivered to the older adult's home. Tuesday and Thursday meals are a cold bag lunch delivered with the previous day's hot meal.

Volunteers from the local senior center deliver the meals to the older adult's home. The Northeastern Senior Center is seeking volunteers for home delivered meals, please call 266-1400 if interested. Although this is a brief contact it does provide a check on the well being of the homebound individual. The home delivered meal service is not a cost shared service.

Monetary donations can be made to the York County Area Agency on Aging.

Care managers need to complete an in-home assessment to determine eligibility for Home Delivered Meals.

Eligibility for Home Delivered Meals

To be eligible for Home Delivered Meals services an individual must be:

- A York County resident in a non-institutional setting.
- 60 years of age or older.
- Have a physical, mental or emotional disability, which prohibits the individual from leaving his/her residence on a regular basis and/or prevents them from preparing a nutritious meal.

Living alone or with someone who also meets the above criteria.

Weather Warnings

With the winter months upon us, please take note of the following warning terms that PEMA (Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency) advises are used when broadcasting alerts:

WINTER STORM WATCH - Be alert. A storm is likely.

WINTER STORM WARNING - Take action. The storm is in or near the area.

BLIZZARD WARNING – Snow and strong winds combined will produce blinding snow, near zero visibility, deep drifts and life-threatening wind chill. Seek refuge immediately.

WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY – Winter weather conditions are expected to cause significant inconveniences and may be hazardous, especially to motorists

FROST/FREEZE WARNING – Below freezing temperatures are expected to cause significant damage to plants, crops or fruit trees.

FLASH FLOOD WATCH – Be alert to signs of flash flooding and be ready to evacuate on a moment's notice.

FLASH FLOOD WARNING – A flash flood is imminent. Act quickly to save yourself because you may have only seconds to react.

FLOOD WARNING - Flooding has been reported or is imminent. Take necessary precautions.

Smoke Testing Sewer Lines

Monday through Friday 7:00 am to 3:30 pm

NOTICE – Manchester Township Public Works Department periodically conducts smoke tests of the sanitary sewer lines.

Smoke **should not** enter premises unless a leak is present. This smoke is non-toxic, non-corrosive, and will not leave a stain. If smoke enters a home, it will soon dissipate. Opening doors and windows will help. Any presence of smoke within the house should be reported to the township office at **764-4646**. Avoid unnecessary exposure to the smoke. The smoke is relatively harmless, but all smoke is temporary and quickly disappears after exposure has ceased.

HOW AND WHEN TO FIGHT COOKING FIRES

- 1. When in doubt, just get out. When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire. Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number after you leave.
- 2. If you do try to fight the fire, be sure others are already getting out and you have a clear path to the exit.
- 3. Always keep an oven mitt and a lid nearby when you are cooking. If a small grease fire starts in a pan, smother the flames by carefully sliding the lid over the pan (make sure you are wearing the oven mitt). Turn off the burner. Do not move the pan. To keep the fire from restarting, leave the lid on until the pan is completely cool.
- 4. In case of an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed to prevent flames from burning you or your clothing.
- 5. If you have a fire in your microwave oven, turn it off immediately and keep the door closed. Never open the door until the fire is completely out. Unplug the appliance if you can safely reach the outlet.
- 6. After a fire, both ovens and microwaves should be checked and/or serviced before being used again.

INTERPLACES AND WOOD STOVES CLEAN

- 1. Have your chimney or wood stove inspected and cleaned annually by a certified chimney specialist.
- 2. Clear the area around the hearth of debris, decorations and flammable materials.
- 3. Leave glass doors open while burning a fire. Leaving the doors open ensures that the fire receives enough air to ensure complete combustion and keeps creosote from building up in the chimney.
- 4. Close glass doors when the fire is out to keep air from the chimney opening from getting into the room. Most glass fireplace doors have a metal mesh screen which should be closed when the glass doors are open. This mesh screen helps keep embers from getting out of the fireplace area.

- 5. Always use a metal mesh screen with fireplaces that do not have a glass fireplace door.
- 6. Install stovepipe thermometers to help monitor flue temperatures.
- 7. Keep air inlets on wood stoves open, and never restrict air supply to fireplaces. Otherwise you may cause creosote buildup that could lead to a chimney fire.
- 8. Use fire-resistant materials on walls around wood stoves.


911 HANG UP CALLS

SNOW REMOVAL

Snow removal presents a challenge to Manchester Township. During an active snowstorm the public works department will attempt to keep open the major routes (arterial and collector) streets of Manchester Township to facilitate the movement of emergency vehicles. As a storm subsides the snowplows will methodically plow each and every public street in Manchester Township. Residents can assist the public works department by moving, where possible, vehicles off of the streets during and after the storm event.

According to the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code, responsibility for the maintenance of sidewalks rests with the adjoining property owner. Therefore, remember to be a good neighbor and remove snow from sidewalks to keep them safe for pedestrians.

The Township is <u>NOT RESPONSIBLE</u> for damage to mailboxes since they are located in the right-of-way. Manchester Township <u>DOES NOT</u> provide snow and ice removal on any state roadways.

HELPFUL HINTS

- When shoveling out the mouth of your driveway, deposit snow to the right or "downstream." This will help to avoid the re-depositing of the snow in your driveway when the plow comes to your street. Remember it is impossible to not have snow pushed into your driveway. Please do not throw the snow from your property into the street.
- 2. Please allow yourself some additional time to travel.
- 3. Use common sense and "Be Patient."
- 4. Keep a flashlight, a battery powered radio and emergency equipment available in case of a disruption in power.

Preventing Frozen Pipes

The best way to protect a fire sprinkler system from freezing is to provide sufficient insulation and maintain adequate heat during the winter months. Insulation helps block the flow of heat or cold from one space to the next. Most sprinkler pipes are within the walls or ceilings. Cold air can enter these concealed spaces through small gaps in the exterior sheathing and insulation and find its way into pipe chases and soffits that focus the air directly onto the sprinkler piping and accelerate freezing.

In attics, piping should be as close to the ceiling as possible with insulation placed over the sprinkler pipe. If you can safely inspect your sprinkler pipes in the attic and you can see exposed pipes; they need to be insulated immediately to prevent freezing. An open attic hatch will allow heat to rise into the attic and could provide enough heat to keep pipes from freezing.

Plumbing pipes providing water to the inside are also prone to freezing during long periods of freezing temperatures. Open cabinet doors that house water pipes and allow the homes heat inside. Slightly open a faucet to allow a small trickle of water - flowing water is more difficult to freeze than standing water in pipes. Remember to shut off and drain the water to all outside hose bibs.

If a water pipe bursts ensure that the location of the water shut-off valve is known and the proper method to turn it off. Contact a professional immediately to initiate repairs.

FIRE HYDRANTS

Clearing snow away from fire hydrants is a very important responsibility.

The fire department **asks residents to clear a** 36-inch path around hydrants to allow for access.

If you join together with your neighbors, it only takes a few minutes to ensure the fire hydrants are clear of snow. Please take the few extra minutes needed to protect your home and family.

Nuisance Ordinance

Per Ordinance #2007-01, don't place basketball hoops or other sporting equipment in roadway or in road right-of-way so play can occur in the street. The following are strictly prohibited and declared a nuisance:

- a) The throwing, pushing, blowing, placing or plowing of snow from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.
- b) Piling snow more than 3 feet high within the clear sight triangle of any intersection of any street.
- c) The placing of mulch, stone, dirt or building materials from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.
- d) Basketball hoops or other sports equipment within the street or road right-of-way.
- e) Detached trailers or storage units within the cartway.
- f) Dumping of any substances (oil, grass, etc.) into any storm sewer.

Stone or brick mailboxes require a road occupancy permit before construction.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with these provisions may be fined up to \$600.00 per day.

Storm Water Management Requirements

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012:

Any building or zoning permit application that proposes any new impervious area must first satisfy the requirements of the storm water management ordinance.

(Ordinance # 2012-05)

<u>Ultimately it is the property owners' responsibility to control runoff from their property.</u>

This requirement is a mandate from the United States Environmental Protection Agency EPA, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection DEP and the County of York. Manchester Township passed Ordinance 2012-05 in order to comply with the mandate. Failure to comply with the mandates would subject the township as a whole to penalties from either DEP and/or EPA.

Plan Ahead For Building Permits

All construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, swimming pools, etc), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained **BEFORE** any work can legally be started. This includes inflatable swimming pools over 18" if new or previously removed.

State law requires the township to adopt the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), better known as the "building code". The UCC allows a municipality up to 15 working days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a completed application is submitted to the municipality. A <u>completed application</u> includes a completely filled out application form, 3 copies of a site plan for the entire lot showing all **existing and proposed** improvements on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and 3 copies of all documentation related to the proposed improvements. Manchester Township strives to process the permits as quickly as possible although during busy times of the year it may take the full 15 working days. <u>NO WORK</u> can be started until you have a granted permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.

Put simply, if property owner builds or places on their lot something that covers the ground so that rainwater cannot penetrate or that will not allow grass to grow something must be done to allow the runoff to soak into the ground under a *normal* rain condition.

Anyone applying for a Building or Zoning Permit is required to address the storm water runoff from any new impervious area to be installed or placed on any lot.

You will need to know the measurements of all structures, patios, sidewalks, swimming pools and paving, existing and proposed, on your lot in order obtain a storm water permit to meet these requirements **BEFORE** a building or zoning permit will be able to be issued.

10 things you can do at home:

- 1. Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways and gutters.
- 2. Never dump anything down storm drains or in streams.
- 3. Vegetate bare spots in your yard.
- 4. Compost your yard waste.
- 5. Use least toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems.
- 6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture runoff.
- 7. Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- 8. Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil.
- 9. Pick up after your pet.
- 10. Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly.

ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE

Ordinance #2009-05

On November 10, 2009 the Board of Supervisors adopted an animal control ordinance which is intended to encourage the proper safe care and management of animals within Manchester Township.

Please note that this ordinance addresses the keeping of domestic animals, as well as feral cat(s), and requires that anyone "keeping" a feral cat or cats, must see that they have been trapped, neutered and released (TNR) back into the wild.

The York County SPCA (717-764-6109) or Manchester Township's animal enforcement officer, Mike Ellis(717-266-1712), can provide assistance with feral cats.

MS-4 & CHESAPEAKE BAY POLLUTION REDUCTION

Manchester Township has been designated as a MS-4 community. MS-4 stands for Municipal Separate Storm System. This means that PA Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) are requiring Manchester Township to monitor and assure that any and all water coming from Manchester Township is managed properly for the volume of water and the cleanliness before it is transported out of the township. To do so the township must not only enact but enforce ordinances dealing with storm water discharges, sanitary sewers and flood plains along streams and creeks. Additionally Manchester Township has joined with other municipalities in attempting to limit the amount of pollution in the water leaving the township that ultimately is discharged into the Chesapeake Bay. By limiting the amount of unpolluted water that gets into the sanitary sewer system unnecessary sewage backups onto the streets and into the streams the township hopes to improve the effectiveness of the sewage treatment plants that serve the township.

YOU CAN HELP

If you see or spot any discharge from or to any storm sewer or storm water management basin that looks or smells like it does not belong there - please contact the Manchester Township Office immediately.

Also please do not put oil, gasoline, paint, weed killer, driveway sealer or any other chemical into any storm sewer basin along the street. Please do not blow grass clippings that may contain fertilizer into any street where it may get carried into the storm sewer system.

The cost of cleaning up is a lot more expensive than preventing it to begin with.





HOW CAN I HELP???



SANITARY SEWER

Many homes are protected by a sump pump that intercepts and removes ground water that seeps into the basement of a house. In bygone days it

was common practice to connect a sump pump discharge to the sanitary sewer lines serving a building. A sump pump can generate

up to 7,000 gallons per day of addi-

tional water from one home. This is the equivalent of an additional 20 homes worth of additional water per home being placed into the sanitary sewer system. Not only can the pipes that take the sewage to the treatment plant not carry this much water but this water must then be treated at the treatment plant before it can be discharged to the receiving stream. This cost all users of the system additional money which will ultimately result in higher sewer bills for all. More importantly if the pipes aren't large enough to handle all this water-backups can occur possibly into your

basement. Yuck what a mess!

WHAT CAN BE DONE?

The more of this ground/rain water that can be removed from the sanitary sewer system the less cost to you now and in the future.

DISCONNECTING YOUR SUMP PUMP

If your sump pump discharges to a pipe or floor drain in your basement it is a good bet that it is connected to a sanitary sewer line. The discharge must be removed from discharging into the sanitary sewer line. This may be as simple as directing the discharge outside of the house through a hose, remembering to keep the discharge point at least 5 feet from the house so that the water does not seep back into the sump pit and at least 5 feet from any neighbor's property line.

DISCONNECTING YOUR DOWNSPOUT FROM THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM IS EASY TO DO YOURSELF

1. Cut the downspout leaving enough space to insert the elbow

2. Tightly cap the end of the pipe sticking out of the ground.

3. Attach an elbow to the end of the downspout & use an extension to direct water away from your home.



DOWNSPOUTS MAY AFFECT ТНЕ SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM

In many older homes (pre1995) it was common practice to construct the downspouts from the roof gutters into the ground and into a foundation drain. In many instances the foundation drain was then connected to either the sump pump pit or directly to the sanitary sewer line. This adds more unpolluted water into the sanitary sewer system adding to the potential for backups and surely additional costs for transporting and treating the water. In some newer homes the downspouts are connected to a seepage pit—These should not be disconnected.



Downspouts that look like this could be connected to the sanitary sewer system.

EACH HOUSEHOLD OR BUSINESS THAT REDIRECTS THEIR STORMWATER OUT OF THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMHELPS SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF SEWAGE BACKING UP INTO BASEMENTS, STREETS AND WATERWAYS
