

Home Delivered Meals

Monday - Friday / 11:00 am - 1:00 pm



The Home Delivered Meals Program is designed to provide a well-balanced daily meal to homebound older adults who are unable to prepare adequate meals for themselves and have no other means for assuring healthful nutrition.

On Monday, Wednesday and Friday, a hot meal is delivered to the older adult's home. Tuesday and Thursday meals are a cold bag lunch delivered with the previous day's hot meal.

Volunteers from the local senior center deliver the meals to the older adult's home. The Northeastern Senior Center is seeking volunteers for home delivered meals, please call **717-266-1400** if interested. Although this is a brief contact it does provide a check on the well being of the homebound individual. The home delivered meal service is not a cost shared service.

Monetary donations can be made to the York County Area Agency on Aging.

Care managers need to complete an in-home assessment to determine eligibility for Home Delivered Meals.

Eligibility For Home Delivered Meals

To be eligible for Home Delivered Meals services an individual must be:

- A York County resident in a non-institutional setting.
- 60 years of age or older.
- Have a physical, mental or emotional disability, which prohibits the individual from leaving his/her residence on a regular basis and/or prevents them from preparing a nutritious meal.



· Living alone or with someone who also meets the above criteria

The Rent-A-Kid program, sponsored by the York County Area Agency on Aging, is an intergenerational program that connects York County older adults and teenagers together.

For over 30 years, Kids have been helping and learning from older adults through the Rent-A-Kid program. It gives individual teenagers the chance to help York County senior citizens, 60 years or older, with indoor and outdoor household chores. The senior needs to be agreeable to a reimbursement of a minimum of \$5/hour, or a negotiated rate

based on the job.

Health Insurance Assistance



APPRISE is the State Health Insurance Assistance Program which provides counseling for people with Medicare in Pennsylvania. It was created by the Pennsylvania Department of Aging to help Pennsylvanians understand Medicare and their other health insurance benefits. Locally, this program is offered by the York County Area Agency on Aging.

APPRISE counselors are specially-trained volunteers who have direct access to state and federal Medicare resources. They are able to answer questions about Medicare, Medicaid, Medigap, Medicare Advantage plans and the prescription drug program. They can help you to:

• Understand your Medicare benefits by explaining which services are covered under Part A and B and your Medicare Summary Notice.

• Make informed choices about Medicare coverage

options, including Medicare appeals process and assist with appeals paperwork.

• Select a Medigap insurance policy.

• Explain financial assistance programs that may be available to assist in paying for your Medicare premiums, deductibles and coinsurance, as well as your prescription drug needs.

- Explain the Medicare prescription drug benefit.
- Make presentations on Medicare to your organization.

Motorized Vehicles At Township Parks Please Observe Park Rule #12 When Using All Township Parks



The use of motorized vehicles, except on areas designated as driveways or for parking during the time when recreational facilities are open to the public and for Manchester Township maintenance vehicles, within Manchester Township recreational facilities, is **PROHIBITED**. The term "motorized vehicles" shall include, but not be limited to, licensed motor vehicles as defined by the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, trail bikes or dirt bikes, all-terrain vehicles (three or four wheeled,) snowmobiles, golf carts and hoverboards.

Drones / RC Airplanes

The use of motorized model airplanes and drones is restricted to designated areas and prohibited after **9:00 a.m.** Model rockets or the like are prohibited at all times. The restricted hours for the use of drones may be modified upon written request to the township manager or recreation director, and upon request of a written modification. The use of drones must comply with applicable federal aviation administration (FAA) regulations. The drone operator is responsible for compliance.

Tree Trimming Ordinance #2014-01

Property owners are required to maintain clearance of trees and similar vegetation from the street cartway (curb to curb) to a height above the cartway of fourteen feet (14'). Upon notification of a violation, the property owner shall have 30 days to correct the violation prior to being subject to penalties.

Ordinance #2014-01 is available for review on the township web site **mantwp.com**.

3 Foot Hedges

When considering your clean up and/or landscaping, please remember to keep your trees, hedges and bushes trimmed to no higher than three feet (3') within the clear sight triangle of any intersection of any street to improve safety and visibility.

Storm Water Management Requirements

Any building or zoning permit application that proposes any new impervious area must first satisfy the requirements of the storm water management ordinance.

Ultimately it is the property owners' responsibility to control runoff from their property.

This requirement is a mandate from the United States Environmental Protection Agency EPA, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection DEP and the County of York. Manchester Township passed Ordinance 2022-06 in order to comply with the mandate. Failure to comply with the mandates would subject the township as a whole to penalties from

either DEP and/or EPA.

Put simply, if property owner builds or places on their lot something that covers the ground so that rainwater cannot penetrate or that will not allow grass to grow something must be done to allow the runoff to soak into the ground under a *normal* rain condition.

Anyone applying for a Building or Zoning Permit is required to address the storm water runoff from any new impervious area to be installed or placed on any lot.



You will need to know the measurements of all structures, patios, sidewalks, swimming pools and paving, existing and proposed, on your lot in order obtain a storm water permit to meet these requirements **BEFORE** a building or zoning permit will be able to be issued.

Tips from your Tax Collector

It is tax time again and I would like to remind you to <u>PLEASE WRITE A</u> <u>CONTACT PHONE NUMBER ON</u> <u>YOUR CHECK</u>. Unlisted phone numbers make it difficult to reach you if there is a question or problem with your check, resulting in missed rebates and late payments.

The rebate period for 2023 County/ Township payments ends at midnight on April 17, 2023. The office window will be open from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm on Monday, April 17th for last minute payments. Any payments received in the night drop box on the morning of April 18th will be considered paid at rebate. **Please do not ask me to break the law and accept payments after the deadline.**

I receive many requests for changes to the homeowner information on the tax bills. Please note, for your protection, I am not able to change the name printed on your tax notice. The name on the tax bill comes from the York County deed database. If



you would like to change your name due to marriage, etc. it must be changed at the Recorder of Deeds office. The only exception is I can remove a deceased spouse's name from the bill at the surviving spouse's request with a copy of the death certificate.

PLEASE DO NOT POLLUTE. 10 things you can do at home:

- 1. Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways and gutters.
- 2. Never dump anything down storm drains or in streams.
- 3. Vegetate bare spots in your yard.
- 4. Compost your yard waste.
- Use least toxic pesticides, follow labels, and learn how to prevent pest problems.
- 6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces; consider a rain garden to capture runoff.

- Take your car to the car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- 8. Check your car for leaks and recycle your motor oil.

Sewer Backup Claims

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowner's or commercial insurance agent to make sure you carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowner's or commercial property policy. Some homeowner's policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valuable coverage.

"Yard Waste" materials are defined as tree trimmings, shrubbery and any other organic landscape vegetation, **excluding grass clippings**.

Materials should be packaged as follows:

- Place items in either Biodegradable Kraft bags or tied in easily handled bundles.
- Bundles should be no longer than four (4) feet in length.
- Bundles should not weigh more than 30 lbs. each.
- Branches should not exceed 6 inches in diameter.

The following items should not be placed out for Yard Waste Collection:

- Leaf Waste (Note: Manchester Township provides this service)
- Dirt or Stones
- · Fruits and/or Vegetables
- Any material in a Plastic Bag

Leaves Don't Belong In The Stormdrain

When it rains, it drains! Clean up leaves from the stormdrain at home, work or play.

It is illegal to dump anything into the storm sewers located along the streets. Do not dump used oil, gasoline, or grass clippings into the storm sewers.

West Nile

How can you reduce the number of mosquitoes around your home and neighborhood?

Mosquitoes breed in standing water. Even a small bucket that has stagnant water in it for seven days can become home to up to 1,000 mosquitoes. Here are some easy tips to eliminate standing water:

- Dispose of tin cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots or similar water holding containers that have accumulated on your property. Do not overlook containers that have become overgrown by aquatic vegetation.
- Pay special attention to discarded tires that may have accumulated on your property.
- Drill holes in the bottom of recycling containers that are left out of doors. Drainage holes that are located on the container sides collect enough water for mosquitoes to breed in.
- Clean clogged roof gutters on an annual basis, particularly if the leaves from surrounding trees have a

tendency to plug up the drains. Roof gutters are easily overlooked but can produce millions of mosquitoes each season.

- Turn over plastic wading pools when not in use. A wading pool becomes a mosquito producer if it is not used on a regular basis.
- Turn over wheelbarrows and do not allow water to stagnate in birdbaths. Both provide breeding habitat for domestic mosquitoes.
- Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish. Water gardens are fashionable but become major mosquito producers if they are allowed to stagnate. Clean and chlorinate swimming pools that are not being used. A swimming pool that is left untended by a family that goes on vacation for a month can produce enough mosquitoes to result in neighborhood-wide complaints. Be aware that mosquitoes may even breed in the water that collects on swimming pool covers.

Spotted Lanternfly

Agriculture Secretary Russell Redding shared some scary thoughts while reminding Pennsylvanians to be vigilant against the Spotted Lanternfly as the bugs begin laying eggs on flat surfaces to hatch in the spring.

"Every Spotted Lanternfly egg mass not scraped and destroyed now is up to 50 more of these invasive, destructive bugs we can expect to hatch next spring," said Redding. "We need every Pennsylvanian to hunt for egg masses this fall and winter and destroy them – or we're in for a scary spring."

Spotted Lanternfly egg masses are a light gray wax-like substance that take on the appearance of mud and include 30-50 eggs. Egg masses can be found on many flat surfaces including trees, rocks, and outside objects such as picnic tables, playground equipment, grills, and sidings of homes.

Property owners can scrape egg masses whenever encountered using a hard or rigid tool such as a credit card, putty knife, or a stick. Research has not yet confirmed whether egg masses can survive if scraped onto the ground, so it is best to scrape the egg masses in a downward motion into a container or bag with rubbing alcohol or hand sanitizer.

Penna. Act 229 of 2002, portions of which became effective on February 21, 2003, requires motorists to turn their headlights on when driving through a posted work zone.

Additionally, Act 229 establishes penalties for a motorist convicted of exceeding the work zone speed limit by 11 miles or more per hour by having his or her license suspended for 15 days.

Animal Control Ordinance / #2009-05

In 2009 the Manchester Township Board of Supervisors adopted an animal control ordinance which addresses the keeping of domestic animals, as well as feral cat(s), and requires that anyone "keeping" a feral cat or cats, must see that they have been trapped, neutered and released (TNR) back into the wild.

The York County SPCA (717-764-6109) or Manchester Township's animal enforcement officer, Michelle Klugh (Klugh Animal Control) (717-916-1413), can provide assistance with feral cats.

Please be responsible in helping protect public health and safety by participating in a TNR program to control the feral cat population.



🕄 Recycle

Please place all of your trash and recyclables at the curb by **6:00 am** the day of your scheduled collection.



Do **NOT** place trash receptacles at your collection point more **than 24 hours before** the scheduled collection.

This would be a violation of Section 20-105.1 of the Manchester Township Code of Ordinances.

It is also a violation of Section 20-210 to steal recyclable materials from recycling containers.

Medication Take-Back Box Program

York County residents may anonymously deliver unused prescription and over-the-counter medications to secure Medication Return Boxes located in nearly all York County Police Department lobbies. There is no fee and the boxes are available year-round during lobby hours as listed, except on holidays. Residents interested in disposing of medication in a Medication Return Box location should remove their personal information from containers before disposal.

Place unused medications in your regular garbage – To minimize potential impacts to human health and the environment, take medication out of its original container and mix it with an undesirable substance, such as used coffee grounds or kitty litter. The medication will be less appealing to children and pets, and unrecognizable to people who may intentionally go through your trash. Place the mixture in a sealed bag, can or other container to prevent the medication from leaking. Before disposing of a prescription medicine container, destroy all identifying information to protect your identity and personal health information.

Free prescription medication delivery at the RRC – Make an appointment to deliver your unused prescription (no over-the-counter) medications to the RRC at no charge. Prescription medications accepted must come from a single York County household (medications collected from multiple households cannot be accepted). Residents must call 717-845-1066 to make an appointment to deliver prescription medications to the RRC and are required to complete a brief registration form. At the

RRC, residents will be escorted by an Authority representative to dispose of the medications. The disposal process takes approximately 20 minutes.

No Parking Zones / What Do The Signs Mean?

Have you wondered what the double arrow signs, which are located under "No Parking" symbol signs, represent? The "No Parking" symbol signs and related double arrows are posted in accordance with PennDOT sign regulations which require the use of the double arrow signs to inform motorists that parking is restricted BETWEEN the posted "No Parking" symbol signs along the same side of the street on which the "No Parking" symbol signs are located. The double arrow signs DO NOT represent that parking is prohibited on both sides of the street.

Nuisance Ordinance

Per Ordinance #2007-01, don't place basketball hoops or other sporting equipment in roadway or in road right-ofway so play can occur in the street.

The following are strictly prohibited and declared a nuisance:

a) The throwing, pushing, blowing, placing or plowing of snow from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.

b) Piling snow more than 3 feet high within the clear sight triangle of any intersection of any street.

c) The placing of mulch, stone, dirt or building materials from private property into or onto a cartway of any street.

d) Basketball hoops or other sports equipment within the street or road right-of-way.

e) Detached trailers or storage units within the cartway.

f) Dumping of any substances (oil, grass, etc.) into any storm sewer.

Stone or brick mailboxes require a road occupancy permit before construction.

Any person who violates or fails to comply with these provisions may be fined up to \$600.00 per day.

Plan Ahead For Building Permits

All construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, swimming pools, etc), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained **BEFORE** any work can legally be started. *This includes inflatable swimming pools over 18" if new or previously removed*.

State law requires the township to adopt the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), better known as the "building code". The UCC allows a municipality up to 15 *working* days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a *completed application* is submitted to the municipality. A completed application includes a completely filled out application form, 3 copies of a site plan for the entire lot showing all **existing and proposed improvements** on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and 3 copies of all documentation related to the proposed improvements. Manchester Township strives to



process the permits as quickly as possible although during busy times of the year it may take the full 15 working days. **NO WORK** can be started until you have a granted permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.

Lets Have A Neighborhood Block Party

HOW? A few simple steps will allow you to close your street for some fun.

Your request should be submitted in writing, in a timely fashion, to the attention of the township manager.

Please include the following in your request:

- 1. The date and time of the block party, & whether there is a rain date.
- 2. A drawing showing the exact location and whether there is an alternate route which can be used by motorists while the road is closed.
- 3. The signature of all property owners adjacent to the section of the affected roadway which you would like to close indicating they have no objection.

The Board of Supervisors must authorize any closures of township streets (this does not include state roadways)

Once these steps are followed, the Board will most likely grant your request. Upon granting such a request, the Board directs that the township public works department drop off barricades which can be used to close the roadway during your block party. The township does request you keep all tables and chairs to one side, so in the event that there would be an emergency situation an ambulance, fire truck or police car, could easily gain access to the area by using the side of the roadway where there are no obstacles.

York Area United Fire and Rescue Fire Prevention and Public Education

Last year, York Area United Fire & Rescue's Fire Prevention efforts reached over 8,600 people. These programs included general fire prevention and safety where children and adults alike learn how to prevent fires but also what to do if one does break out. We held over 495 of these programs and educated over 4,340 people of all ages. You are never too young or old to learn.

Many businesses take advantage of our fire extinguisher program. Last year 843 people were taught not only how to safely use a fire extinguisher, but how to identify several types of fires to use the proper fire extinguisher.

Our PRIDE (Proactive Residential Information Distribution Effort) PROGRAM, with a goal of ensuring each home in our area has at least one working smoking alarm, generated 147 events, with 98 smoke alarms were provided or where our personnel were assisting residents with installation of detectors they purchased on their own.

Community standby events allowed our personnel to educate over 3,497 citizens on fire prevention education and provide a better explanation of what firefighters do. One of the programs we do at community events and commission meetings, which are open to the public, is the Palmer Dollhouse Demonstration. This is a small-scale home built by our firefighters. We burn it to show how fast smoke and fire can travel through the home if the proper precautions are not taken. This also allows us to emphasize the importance of working smoke detectors and sleeping with your bedroom doors closed. We were able to show this in person to well over 300 people in 2022 and are already making plans for increasing these demonstrations in 2023. We also have a recorded video of this presentation on our website.

Along with these presentations we also invite schools, Community groups, home school groups and families to visit our fire stations for a tour. We had 16 recorded visits last year and we would like to see this number rise as we want to connect with the community. Two of our certified staff provided child safety seat installation to 11 families last year. This allowed us to educate parents on safely installing the seat and securing the child. If anyone needs help or education with installing a child safety seat, they just need to call York Area United Fire & Rescue headquarters and we will be glad to schedule a time to assist you.







In 2022 York Area United Fire & Rescue once again offered our Youth Safety Camp to over 25 youth (ages 13 to 17) from throughout the county. In the course of the four-day program, attendees learn what it is like to be a firefighter. They learn everything from how the fire department is organized to what it takes to be a firefighter. Engine Company operations, Truck Company operations, Vehicle Rescue operations. Basic EMS skills and if they choose, they can be CPR certified. This has been a successful program in the past and 2022 was no different. We hope for 2023 to be another huge success. The 2023 Youth Safety Camp will run with tentative dates of August 1st and 3rd and August 8th and 10th. Keep an eye on our website and social media sites for application dates for the program.

Another program we are excited to bring back is our Citizens fire academy. This program is for anyone 18 and older. If you have always wondered what it was like to be a fire fighter, this program will be your opportunity. Citizens Fire Academy will include fire dynamics, department organizational structure, and the reasons behind our operational methods. You will be shown how to properly don protective gear and how to use a self-contained breathing apparatus, how to deploy as a member of a fire attack crew, and practice search techniques through a maze in a simulated search and rescue. You will extinguish a vehicle fire and extricate simulated victims from a vehicle accident. Ladder truck crews will then show you how to throw ladder to a building to assist in rescuing victims from a window. All this training will prepare you for the last day of class when we assist you in extinguishing a real fire in the burn building. We are still trying to lock down dates for this program which we intend to hold at the York County Fire School, so please continue to check our website and social media for additional information.

Safety Town planning is in full swing for 2023 and once more your YAUFR Firefighters will be participating. Please keep checking back to their Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/safetytownyork.org for upcoming information on registration.

Project Lifesaver provides law enforcement with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering.

The necessity of this program was determined through the correlation between cognitive conditions and the act of wandering. The program has grown from a localized program to a program recognized internationally as a proven and effective method of "bringing loved ones home."

The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies their local Project Lifesaver agency, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized

frequency to locate the position of the individual.

The Northern York County Regional Police Department has nine officers trained in the operation of the Project Lifesaver Program. Four of these officers are School Resource Officers.

If you are a Parent, Guardian or Caregiver of an individual that is at risk of wandering away and you feel they should be enrolled in the Project Lifesaver Program please visit **www.nycrpd.org** and complete the information on the Project Lifesaver Page located on the right side of the home page.
