• How long does it take?

 Filling in the online form only takes a few minutes. It may take the library a few days to create your card, but they'll let you know right away when it's ready.



• How do I get my card?

- The library will email you the library card info as soon as it's made, if you provide an email.
- The library will also mail the physical card to your home, along with helpful library info.
- When can I start using the library to check out items?
 - As soon as you've received an email with your library card info, even before the physical card arrives! The library card number will work right away online to place holds and for digital items. In person, if you visit any YCL library, they can look you up if your card hasn't arrived (or if you forget it).

How long are cards good for?

• Library cards are good for 3 years, and renewing is as quick as updating your contact info.

Manchester Township, in coordination with Martin Library and York County Libraries, offers a pickup/drop off service at the township building as an added convenience for Manchester Township residents. Choose Manchester Township as the location to hold your material(s).


BUDGET SYNOPSIS

MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP 2025 TOTAL ALL FUNDS





2025 County, Local & School Taxes

Pennsylvania property tax is assessed based on millage rates established by three entities: County, School District, and Municipality.


Here in Manchester Township our property taxes are divided amount York County, Central York School District, and Manchester Township.



One mill is equal to 1/1,000 of a dollar tax on your property value, so if your property is worth \$100,000 your tax will be \$3,064. \$2,274 goes to the school district, \$690 goes to the county, \$100 goes to our local government. Manchester Township does not receive any portion of either county or school taxes.

Compare Manchester Township

Comparing apples to apples between municipalities isn't easy. Many factors affect the cost and responsibilities a municipality must cover, such as miles of road to maintain, overall acreage, total population, and local services. The closest population comparison to Manchester Township may be West Manchester Township.



To offer you more convenient ways to pay your sewer/trash bills, Manchester Township now offers online payments and paperless billing options. We have partnered with Xpress Bill Pay, the premier provider of online & electronic payment systems. All you need is an internet connection and an email address. It is simple to use. Every quarter we'll send you a reminder email to let you know when your bill is online. Then, you



just log into your account at xpressbillpay.com or use our mobile app to view your bill. When you're ready to pay your bill, select a payment type. You can pay with credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. Enter the information and you are done! It's that easy, and only takes you a few minutes each quarter. Or you can set up your bill on Auto Pay and have it automatically paid for you each quarter.

Plan Ahead For Building Permits

All construction, additions, placement of prebuilt structures (sheds, swimming pools, etc), paving, patios, fences, and decks require that a permit be obtained BEFORE any work can legally be started. This includes inflatable swimming pools over 18" if new or previously removed.

State law requires the township to adopt the Uniform Construction Code (UCC), better known as the "building code". The UCC allows a municipality up to 15 business days to review a permit application for residential properties and either grant or reject the permit from the time a complete application is submitted to the municipality. A complete application includes a completely filled out application form, a copy of a site plan for the entire lot showing all existing and proposed improvements on the lot (including driveways, buildings, patios, decks, and sidewalks) with all dimensions and distances to property lines and all documentation related to the proposed improvements. Manchester Township strives to process the permits as quickly as possible although during busy times of the year it may take the full 15 business days. NO WORK can begin until you have a granted permit in hand and a placard placed in a location that can be seen from the street.

Please note, any work that adds impervious surface to your property will also require a stormwater management permit.

Keep Your Furry Friends Safe This Holiday Season!

The holiday season is soon upon us which means a lot of fun festivities are in store! Many of us have furry family members and we want to include them in the fun too, but there are a few important safety tips to keep in mind around the holiday season.

During the holidays, the environment in our homes often changes. The house looks different with decorations, more packages may be delivered, enticing smells fill the air, and more visitors come. While we look forward to the festivities, the new sounds, smells, and changes can cause stress for some dogs. Consider keeping your dog in a room away from the bulk of the activity until people are settled. Even then, spending time around people, especially little children, should be limited or done supervised, on-leash. Extra excitement outside of your dog's routine may elevate their stress, especially those prone to be more anxious.



The door may be opened more with deliveries and people coming

and going. Make sure your dog is secure before opening the door. They should be on a leash, behind a closed gate or door, or in a crate. Make sure everyone in the family follows your safety plan. To be safe, your dog should be microchipped and wear a collar with up-to-date ID tags if they slip out the door or fence.

Keep extension cords and tree lights out of reach of dogs, especially puppies in the chewing stage. Putting an exercise pen around the tree will help to keep your dog safe and your tree intact. Avoid decorations such as tinsel, ornament hooks, and popcorn strings, which can harm dogs. If you choose to decorate with these items, ensure they are high enough to be out of your pet's reach. When opening gifts, it is best to quickly remove paper, ribbon, and bows from areas where your dog tends to wander around so that none of these items are ingested.

Be especially careful with food. At a time when people may leave plates of food lying around from room to room, your dogs must not have access to the food, or the trash can until clean-up has been done. Unless someone always has eyes on your dog, it is too easy for him to help himself to food that may not be safe, including the following:

- Cooked turkey bones
- Fatty meat scraps
- Foods containing chocolate, cocoa, raisins, grapes, currants, and some nuts
- Alcohol
- Sugar-free gums and candies that contain xylitol

If your dog accidentally ingests one of the food or drink items above, please immediately contact your veterinarian or an animal emergency hospital.

Wintertime Trash Collection Can Be Tricky

Winter is here! In order to prepare for trash collection in inclement weather, below are several reminders from our friends at Penn Waste to help ensure that your trash will be picked up safely:

- Access to Your Trash & Recycling Please make sure there is a clear, safe path to access your trash and recycling bins.
- Be Patient Trash and recycling may not be collected at the exact time or on the same day that it is usually collected due to poor weather conditions.



- Children Ask your children to play away from the streets as visibility may be impaired due to weather conditions.
- Slow Down Before You Go Around —Make sure you slow down before you go around after checking for on-coming traffic and trash collectors who may be at the side of the truck.
- Keep Your Eyes on the Road When Driving Keep your eyes on the road at all times and give yourself some room between other vehicles when driving.

Observed holidays are noted in RED. Collection days that fall on or after the holiday will be delayed one day. EXCEPTION: If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in service prior to or after the holiday.

BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

- Trash, Recycling, and one bulk item must be curb side by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- All trash must fit within the provided mobile trash cart in order to be collected.
- Bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people will not be accepted.
- Yard Waste is collected on the 1st Saturday of the month May through November. (See calendar above)
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curb side.

Tips from your Tax Collector

Financial scams and identity theft are on the rise and the reliability of the US Mail service is not what it used to be! Below are some simple steps we can all take to protect our financial integrity.

- Nevergive out personal information to strangers in response to texts, emails, or phone calls. Always verify the inquiry is genuine by calling the person or institution directly before providing protected information.
- Review your financial statements at least monthly and immediately contact your institution if you see unauthorized usage or something seems amiss. It is also prudent to monitor your credit reports annually by visiting annualcreditreport.com or calling 877-322-8228 for free reports.
- Make sure outbound mail is put in a secure USPO mailbox. Scammers can easily target mailboxes with the flag "up" to gain access to credit card and bank account information.

Reminders:

- 1. Dispose of shoveled snow in vegetated areas. This wil allow the snow to ilfiltrate instead of becoming runoff.
- 2. Use-deicing chemicals and salts sparingly. Focus on making your walkways and driveways safe but avoid overusing or spreading in vegetated areas or near waterways.
- 3. Start shoveling early! The more snow you remove, the less salt you will need.
- 4. Make sure your nearest storm drains are clear. Do not pile snow on storm drains and make sure your neighborhood plow is not piling show over the drain.

Under the Pennsylvania Governmental Immunity Statute, Manchester Township has limited legal responsibility for sewer and water backups. You should contact your homeowner's or commercial insurance agent to make sure you carry coverage for sewer and water backups under your homeowner's or commercial property policy. Some homeowner's policies do not include this coverage automatically. We recommend that you purchase this valuable coverage.

Recycle

Please place all of your trash and recyclables at the curb by **6:00 am** the day of your scheduled collection.



Reminder

Do **NOT** place trash receptacles at your collection point more than **24 hours before** the scheduled collection.

This would be a violation of Section 20-105.1 of the Manchester Township Code of Ordinances.

It is also a violation of Section 20-210 to steal recyclable materials from recycling containers.



Vandalism Costs You...

Whenever there is a theft or disfigurement of road signs and other township property, this vandalism costs tax dollars to replace and repair – dollars that could be spent elsewhere.

A lost & found is located at the township office. If you are missing items and may have left them at one of our parks or in our gym, please check at the municipal office.

Snow Removal



Snow removal presents a challenge to Manchester Township. During an active snowstorm, the public works department will attempt to keep open the major routes (arterial and collector streets of Manchester Township) to facilitate the movement of emergency vehicles.

As a storm subsides, the snowplows will methodically plow each and every public street in Manchester Township. Residents can assist the public works department by moving, where possible, vehicles off of the streets during and after the storm event.

According to the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code, responsibility for the maintenance of sidewalks rests with the adjoining property owner. Therefore, remember to be a good neighbor and remove snow from sidewalks to keep them safe for pedestrians.

The township is NOT RESPONSIBLE for damage to mailboxes since they are located in the right-of-way.

Manchester Township **DOES NOT** provide snow and ice removal on any state roadways.

Helpful Hints

- 1. When shoveling out the mouth of your driveway, deposit snow to the right or "downstream." This will help to avoid the re-depositing of the snow in your driveway when the plow comes to your street. Remember it is impossible to not have snow pushed into your driveway. Please do not throw the snow from your property into the street.
- 2. Please allow yourself some additional time to travel.
- 3. Use common sense and "Be Patient."
- 4. Keep a flashlight, a battery powered radio and emergency equipment available in case of a disruption in power.

Fire Hydrants

Clearing snow away from fire hydrants is a very important responsibility.

The fire department asks residents to clear a **36-inch path around hydrants** to allow for access.

If you join together with your neighbors, it only takes a few minutes to ensure the fire hydrants are clear of snow. Please take the few extra minutes needed to protect your home and family.

The COLD Weather Is Here!

Let's remember some of these safety tips to stay safe this winter:

- 1. Have your heating appliances serviced to maintain proper function.
- 2. Make sure all vents are cleaned and clear of obstruction, especially on the outside of the home. Be aware of snow build up during larger storms.
- 3. If you heat with wood in a woodstove or fireplace, have your chimneys and stove pipes cleaned.
- 4. Burn seasoned wood. Burning wood with a higher moisture content can create creosote buildup. Creosote buildup diminishes the diameter of your flue slowing air flow. This can cause the fire to not burn efficiently, possibly causing a Carbon Monoxide build up in the home. Creosote buildup causes many chimney fires every year. Sometimes these fires extend into the home. This is why it is important to have your chimney inspected and cleaned every year, especially if you use it for heat on a normal basis.
- 5. Any gas appliance, even if maintained can malfunction. If not burning efficiently it can sometimes cause carbon monoxide in the home. Carbon Monoxide is colorless and odorless, which is why it is so important to have at least one working Carbon Monoxide Detector in the home. It does not hurt to have one on every floor.
- 6. Finally, make sure you have a working smoke detector on every floor, at a minimum. We prefer one in every bedroom and sleeping with your bedroom doors closed. Early detection and early warning are the key to getting yourself to safety.

York Area United Fire & Rescue Winter Storm Awareness

With winter storm potential quickly approaching and the lack of snow in previous years, it is easy to get complacent on the dangers of snow build up around our homes. Deep snow can be a problem but so can small snowstorms. Wind can pile up small snow to a point where vents and utility access can be affected just like heavy snow.

By snow piling up and blocking the vents, gas fired appliances cannot operate efficiently, which could cause carbon monoxide to build up in the home. Frequently check them during snowstorms to make sure they stay clear. This includes dryers and gas fueled fireplaces.

Check the utilities around your home at the same time. Gas meters and electrical drops may need to be accessed in an emergency. Keep them clear as well.

This also includes the fire hydrant that may be on your property or adjacent to it. Try to keep fire hydrants at least 3ft clear all around it and clear to the street. This gives space for the fire engine to get close and for the firefighters to work. As well as saving precious time.







Animal Control Ordinance / #2009-05

In 2009 the Manchester Township Board of Supervisors adopted an animal control ordinance which addresses the keeping of domestic animals, as well as feral cat(s), and requires that anyone "keeping" a feral cat or cats, must see that they have been trapped, neutered and released (TNR) back into the wild.

Manchester Township's animal enforcement officer, Michelle Klugh (Klugh Animal Control, 717-916-1413), can provide assistance with feral cats.

Please be responsible in helping protect public health and safety by participating in a TNR program to control the feral cat population.

Lawncare's Winter Break

As the lawn maintenance season nears its end and the last of the leaves are being mulched, it seems an appropriate time to review the winter nutrient management rules.

Remember, nutrients should only be applied when the turf is actively growing. So as winter approaches and temperatures cool, our lawns go dormant. At this point, nutrients are generally no longer needed until the spring growing season resumes.

However, should a nutrient need arise, remember to follow these additional winter fertilizer use restrictions.

- Nitrogen is restricted to 0.50 lbs/1000 ft² from December 15 through March 1.
- Phosphate is always prohibited unless the turf is being repaired or established or a soil test indicates a phosphorus need.
- Do not apply fertilizer to frozen or snow-covered ground.
- Do not use fertilizer as a snow or ice melt.

Enjoy the winter lawncare break - winterize the mower, properly store any remaining product, and always be wise when you fertilize!




Project Lifesaver provides law enforcement with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. The necessity of this program was determined through the correlation between cognitive conditions and the act of wandering. The program has grown from a localized program to a program recognized internationally as a proven and effective method of "bringing loved ones home."

The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist or ankle that emits an individualized frequency signal. If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies their local Project Lifesaver agency, and a trained emergency team responds to the wanderer's area. The first responders will then use the client's individualized frequency to locate the position of the individual.

The Northern York County Regional Police Department has nine officers trained in the operation of the Project Lifesaver Program. Four of these officers are School Resource Officers.


